

Careers Breakfasts at Crestwood School

Who?	 Volunteers from a range of professions to deliver a short talk/ presentation. Small groups of year 10 and 11 students to join the sessions (maximum of around 30 students).
What?	Volunteers delivering a careers breakfast session where they will discuss their career/career pathway with students. The session will last 15 – 20 minutes.
Where?	 Crestwood School, Bromley Lane, Kingswinford, Dudley, DY6 8QG. Classroom to be confirmed on the day (if in person). Parking is available in the visitor car park at the front of the school. Sessions can also be delivered virtually using Microsoft Teams.
When?	Tuesday mornings, 8.45am – 9.05am. If you are delivering a session in person, please arrive at Crestwood reception at 8.35am where you will be greeted by a member of staff who will show you to the classroom that the session will be ran in.
How?	The careers breakfast session can be delivered in person or virtually, via Microsoft Teams. A short presentation ($15-20$ minutes) would be useful where the volunteer will discuss their career/ career pathway with students. Please see below for examples of discussion points that may be included:
	 Career pathways Reasons for choosing the career/ inspirations How to access the career – qualifications, work experience etc. What the role involves Positives/ benefits of the career Related careers (anything else that may help students to understand more about the career/ would
	help to inspire the students). Note: Not all of these points need to be discussed – it is up to the discretion of the volunteer (and it would also be difficult to cover all points within the timeframe). Time for Q&A could be included at the end (if there is no time, students can email the school careers lead to pass questions on).
Why?	 To give key stage four students an insight into the wide range of professions that are available to them. To inform students about career pathways so that they know how to get in to certain careers. To prepare students for the world of work.
